Retired Professor Donates \$1M for AMC Screening Room

Emmy Award-Winner Alan Armer Provides Charitable Remainder Trust for 120-Seat Room in New Building

Emmy Award-winning television writer and producer Alan Armer, a retired Cal State Northridge professor, has donated \$1 million to the university to fund a new 120-seat screening room that will enable the campus to host first-run features.

Armer, a CSUN Distinguished Teaching Award winner who taught in the Radio-Television-Film Department from 1980 to 1999, said he chose to make the gift largely because of the fun he had teaching at CSUN.

"I was lucky, I taught fun classes like writing and directing. Every year there were new movies and television shows to talk about, stuff the students were interested in," Armer said.

"I really enjoyed the students, they were very much alive. Each day I went to class, it was like looking in a mirror. They would see themselves -their excitement for what we were doing - reflected in me and I would see reflections of me in them."

The Alan and Elaine Armer Irrevocable Charitable Remainder Trust will pay for the 120-seat screening room in the new College of Arts, Media, and Communication Building, currently under construction and designed by renowned architect Robert A.M. Stern. The screening room will be named for Armer and his wife Elaine.

The gift was announced recently at the launching of the university's new capital initiative, CSUN Rising, which has a goal of raising \$10 million to restore and upgrade the university's teaching facilities, instructional technology, laboratory equipment and instructional furnishings.

Faye Ainsworth, development director for the college, said Armer's gift is particularly significant because it is the largest the university has ever received from a faculty member.

William Toutant, interim dean for the College of Arts, Media, and Communication, added that Armer's gift will be greatly appreciated by the students, faculty and staff in the college.

"It is especially meaningful that a faculty member has chosen to give back to his department in such an eloquent way," Toutant said. "It also underscores the importance of the campus community in the capital initiative."

Judy Marlane, chair of the Radio-Television-Film Department, called Armer "an outstanding teacher who was able to



combine the vast professional experience he possessed with student needs to make learning meaningful."

"The new screening room will make it possible for our students to study some of the great films in the history of the discipline in their original format, and in an appropriate setting," Marlane said, adding that the campus has lacked such a facility until now. Student films also will be screened in the new facility, she said.

And, in a potential benefit for the entire campus, Marlane said companies in the movie industry have offered the university first-run screenings of new feature films once the new venue becomes available. The department hopes to equip the room with 35mm, 16mm, video and computer projection capabilities.

Armer, who lives on the Westside of Los Angeles, received his bachelor's degree in speech and drama from Stanford University and a master's in theatre arts from UCLA. He started his entertainment career at a radio station in San Jose where he worked as an announcer for about a year.

After moving to Los Angeles in search of a radio job, Armer began working at an advertising agency that specialized in a then-new form of communication technology: television. In that role, Armer later wrote, acted in, directed, narrated and edited television commercials.

From there, Armer and a friend were able to create their own television show, "Lights, Camera, Action," which aired on the local NBC affiliate for three years. He later was hired by the station as a floor manager and then director. He went on to Fox, where he wrote, produced and directed several television series, including "My Friend Flicka."

Armer later became executive producer for the award-winning Desilu production of "The Untouchables." He subsequently joined Quinn Martin Productions, where he produced "The Fugitive" (for which he received an Emmy), "The Invaders" and the first year of "Cannon." "The Fugitive" recently was inducted by the Producers Guild of America into its Hall of Fame.

It was only then, after occasional forays into lecturing at Stanford and USC, that Armer became a CSUN faculty member in 1980. "I guess I was suffering burnout at the time," Armer said of his transition from television to teaching. "Nearly everything I had worked on had been successful and I had won a lot of awards. But I just wasn't happy anymore. My wife asked me why I kept doing it."

About that time, Armer received a call from the chair of CSUN's R-TV-F Department. "He asked me if I wanted to teach a writing class. I asked him, 'When do I start?' And he said, 'How about the day after tomorrow?'" Armer recalled. "I loved it. It was great fun and the kids were just wonderful."

Armer started teaching part time, and eventually shifted to full-time status before becoming a full professor. He retired last year and now writes poetry and consults with people writing screenplays, but admits sometimes missing working with students. "I enjoyed every minute I spent working with those kids," he said.

New Campus Digital Printing System Comes Online

Xerox DocuTech Unit Brings Higher Quality and Increased Convenience

High-quality digital printing accessible to the entire university community, in which each copy looks like an original, has come to the Cal State Northridge campus in a big way. And campus officials say the change means a new era of quality and convenience for campus users.

To start the new millennium, CSUN's Reprographics/QuickCopies operation in the University Student Union has acquired a new Xerox DocuTech digital printing system that not only will provide new levels of reproduction quality, but also allow campus users to submit their documents entirely via the Internet.



"Purchasing and Logistical Services Director Bill Cooper and I have been working on this project for the past two years," said Mary Hanson, manager of the department's Reprographics/ QuickCopies operation. "We're trying to upgrade our services and improve them to make them more convenient for users."

The change to the new DocuTech 6135 machine also has been a good one in financial terms. By trading in other equipment, QuickCopies did not increase its overall costs by acquiring the new machine. And, the pricing for its copies will remain the same as standard photocopies, Hanson said.

What's the difference between digital copies and photocopies? In terms of quality, the digital copies have a resolution of 600 dots per inch, more than double that of standard photocopies, and are a good choice for work that includes pictures or other imagery. In essence, each copy looks like a first-generation original.

But the other major change will be convenience. Instead of hand delivering documents for duplication, campus users now will be able to place orders and submit their documents entirely via the Internet around the clock, and have the orders return delivered and the charges billed to their departments.

The online site for that will be QuickCopies' web page: www-admn.csun.edu/quickcopies/. Customers can submit documents online either as Adobe Acrobat .pdf files, or as PostScript files, which many word processing programs can create by selecting the "print to file" option.

The new DocuTech machine weighs in at more than 2,500 pounds and is roughly 11 feet long and almost four feet wide. Although the unit is housed in the Engineering Building, Hanson said in-person orders for its use still should be placed at the QuickCopies office in the University Student Union.

The new machine can handle black-and-white single or double-sided printing, paper sizes up to 12 by 18 inches, paper stocks from 20 to 65 pounds in weight, and various stapling and tape binding options. But, the only ways it accepts

documents are either as digital files or from scanned paper originals.

Another of the new system's exciting features is the ability to store and vend documents online. For example, university departments that regularly use standard documents, instead of having them bulk printed in large quantities and then stored, could keep a digital version online and have copies printed as needed.

Similarly, professors who use class notes or other instructional materials can have them scanned and placed into an online folder through QuickCopies, password protected if desired, where students can view and/or print them via the Internet from any location.

For fall 2000, Hanson said the new system will bring an enhancement to the 150 to 200 "Coursepack" class booklets done for faculty each semester. Students will be able to order those documents online and have the paper document mailed to their homes.
